

cowboy boot

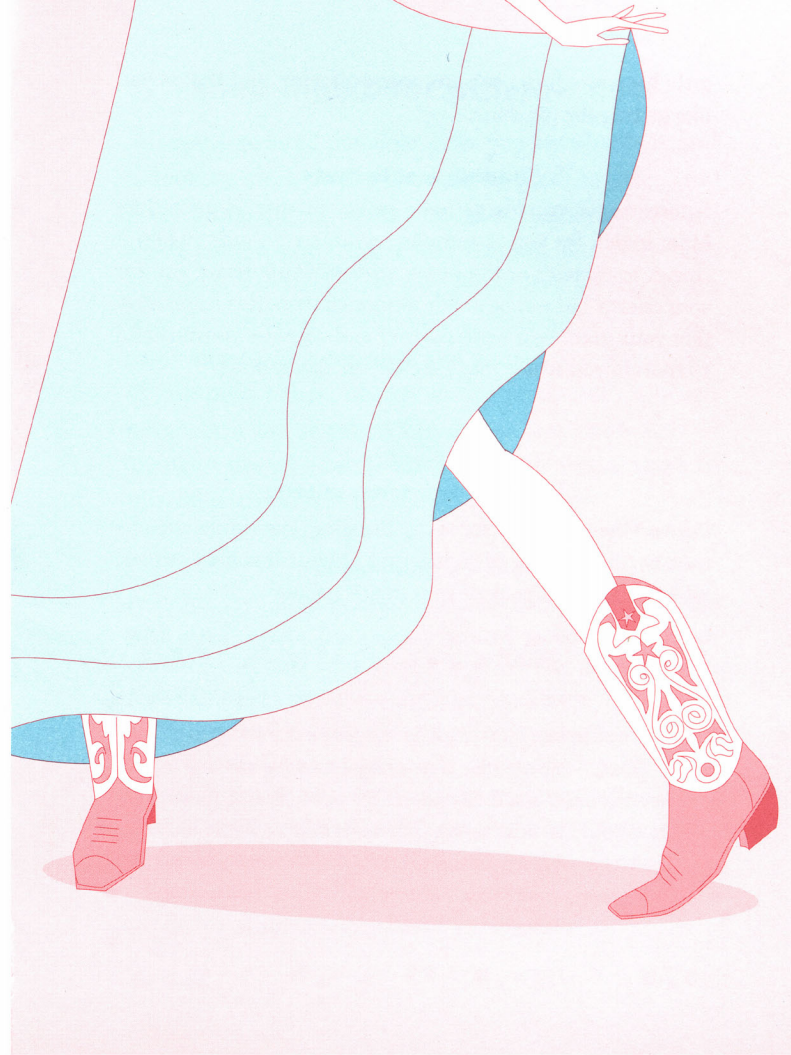
